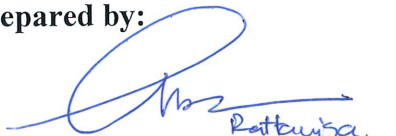
2. School

This project will help examine ethical responsibilities that schools have toward stakeholders.

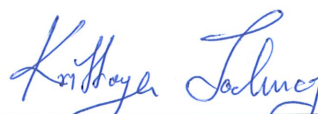
3. Students

PART II: Community Clean-Up Drive

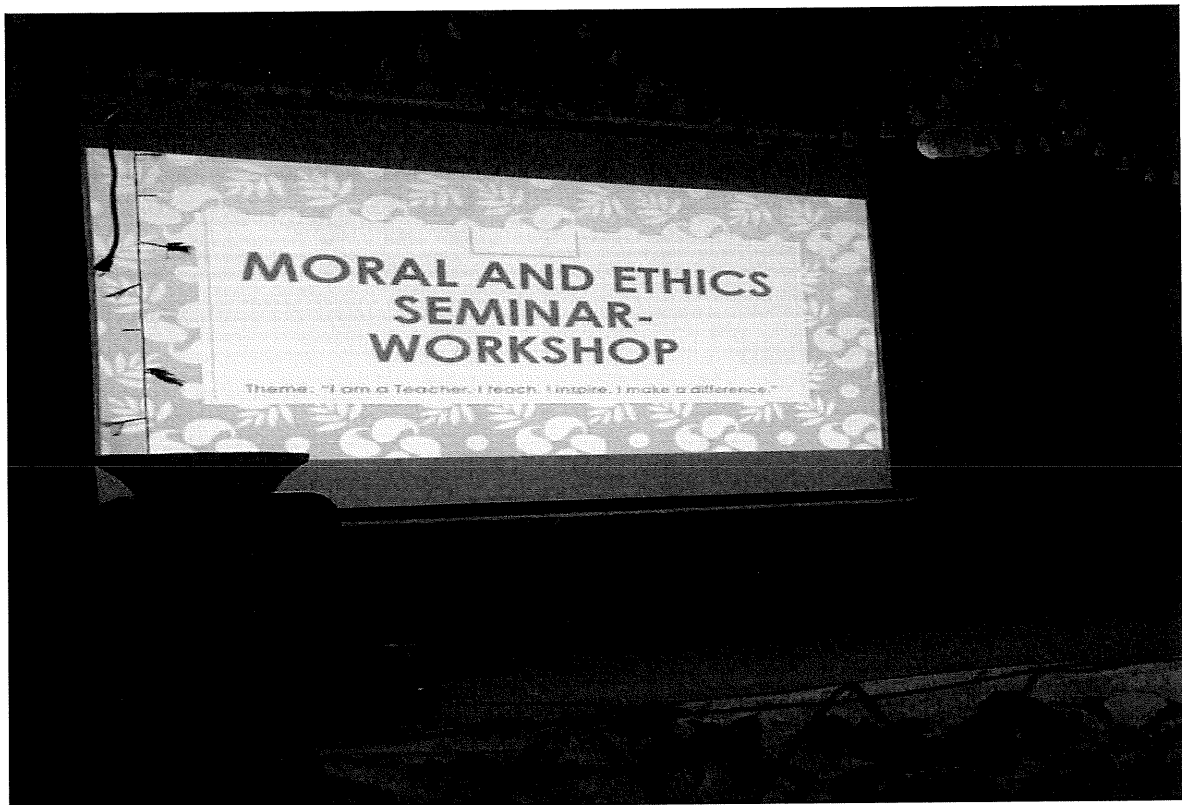
All camp participants will join in this activity. Participants will collect trashes and put them in proper place. This will answer the part of the evaluation which is Active citizen.
